

Provider Enrollment Moratoria

Effective **June 11, 2026**, North Dakota Medicaid has implemented a state-initiated temporary enrollment moratorium on the following provider types:

- **Non-Emergency Medical Transportation (NEMT) Agencies statewide**
- **Qualified Service Provider (QSP) Agencies in Burleigh and Cass Counties**
- **Developmental Disability (DD) Agencies in Burleigh and Cass Counties**

These moratoria apply only to new provider enrollments and do not affect currently enrolled providers. Applications already in the final approval stage as of the effective date will continue through to approval. Applications that have not reached final approval status before the effective date will be denied.

Why this action is being taken

Under [42 CFR § 455.470](#), states may place temporary moratoria, caps, or limits on new Medicaid provider enrollments when a provider type is identified as presenting a heightened risk of fraud, waste, or abuse, provided the action does not restrict beneficiary access to necessary services. North Dakota Medicaid has determined that these temporary enrollment limits are appropriate and will not negatively impact access to care.

Duration

The moratoria are temporary, lasting 6 months, and may be extended in additional 6-month periods if justified.

North Dakota Medicaid will continue to monitor access, program integrity needs, and provider capacity, and will issue updates as more information becomes available.
