ELIGIBILITY

ARE HUMAN SERVICE ZONES PREPARED TO DETERMINE INDIVIDUALS ELIGIBLE FOR THE 1915!?

- Medicaid has informed HSZ on what needs to be done to determine eligibility for 1915i services. There is a list of eligibility workers at the zones that have been trained.

IS A PROVIDER ABLE TO IMPLEMENT THE **WHODAS** ASSESSMENT FOR SOMEONE WHO DESIRES SERVICES FROM THE SAME PROVIDER? OR IS THAT A CONFLICT OF INTEREST?

- Unfortunately, the WHODAS assessment or diagnosis must be completed by someone not affiliated with the same provider they would like to receive services from. This is a requirement from Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).

How do you determine the need for Housing Services and Peer Support Service when the WHODAS does not really address these areas.? How does the Care Coordinator tie this need back to the WHODAS to authorize Services? How will it be determined if a care coordination client is eligible for transportation to referred resources?

- When a Care Coordinator meet with the individual, they have the ability to ask more detailed questions regarding potential needs of the individual and aligning those needs to services.
- The needed services of the individual must be included in the Plan of Care the Care Coordinator completes in MMIS <u>Plan of Care.pdf (nd.gov)</u>.

WEBSITE TO IDENTIFY PROVIDER SHORTAGE AREAS PLEASE?

- The Mental Health provider shortage area map is on the 1915(i) Website. At this time the only counties not identified as mental health provider shortage areas are Burleigh, Morton, Ward, Cass, and Grand Forks.

ARE CARE COORDINATORS ALLOWED TO PROVIDE REMOTE SERVICES?

- 25% of Care Coordination Services provided to an individual in a calendar month can be provided remotely if the following Remote Service Delivery requirements are met:
 - o Remote services are elected by the individual receiving services;
 - o Remote services do not block the member's access to the community;
 - Remote services do not prohibit needed in-person services for the member;
 - o Remote services utilize a HIPAA compliant platform; and
 - o Remote services prioritize the integration of the member into the community.

WHAT IF YOU ARE THE ONLY PROVIDER IN THAT AREA?

I UNDERSTAND A CARE COORDINATOR CANNOT PROVIDE THE SERVICES TO THE CLIENT, BUT WAS IT STATED THAT THAT ANOTHER EMPLOYEE IN THE ORGANIZATION CAN PROVIDE THE SERVICES? THIS WOULD BE FOR SERVICES IN A LARGER ZONE AREA.

- A 42 CFR 441.301(c)(1)(vi) disallows providers of 1915(i) HCBS Services to also provide the Care Coordination service to the same individual. However, there are two North Dakota CMS Approved Exceptions:
 - Exception #1: The member resides in a designated Mental Health Provider Shortage Area (MHPSA).
 - The State uses the University of North Dakota Center for Rural Health's
 map https://ruralhealth.und.edu/assets/2783-12672/nd-mental-hpsa.pdf as the official list of shortage areas. Currently, all counties in North Dakota other than Burleigh, Cass, Grand Forks, Morton and Ward are designated mental health professional shortage areas.
 - A provider may provide both care coordination and other 1915(i) services to the same member when:
 - The 1915(i) member resides within a county designated as a Mental Health Professional Shortage Area; and,
 - The 1915(i) provider implements certain conflict of interest protections.
 - Exception #2: The provider is the only willing and qualified provider with experience and knowledge to serve the individual who shares a common language or cultural background.
 - A provider may provide both care coordination and other 1915(i) services to the same member when:
 - The provider has submitted a written request to the State Medicaid office providing evidence they are the only willing and qualified provider with experience and knowledge to serve the individual who shares a common language or cultural background; and,
 - The State Medicaid office approves the request; and,
 - The 1915(i) provider implements certain conflict of interest protections.

CAN A CLIENT RECEIVE BOTH CARE COORDINATION AND PEER SUPPORT SERVICES FROM THE SAME PROVIDER?

- Based on a requirement by Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) This is dependent on where the services are being provided.
 - A client can receive both Care Coordination and Peer Support services from the same provider if the provider is in a designated mental health shortage area.
 - A client must receive Care Coordination and Peer Support services by different providers if located in any of the 5 counties not designated shortage areas (Burleigh, Morton, Ward, Grand Forks, Cass) https://ruralhealth.und.edu/assets/2783-12672/nd-mental-hpsa.pdf
