

The North Dakota Medicaid 1915(i) State Plan Amendment allows North Dakota Medicaid to pay for additional home and community-based services to support individuals with behavioral health conditions.

For individuals to be eligible to receive services reimbursed through the 1915(i), individuals must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Age 0+; and
- 2. Enrolled in ND Medicaid or Medicaid Expansion; and
- Have a household income at or below 150% of Federal Poverty Level; and
- 4. Receive a WHODAS score of 25 or above; and
- Reside in and will receive services in a setting meeting the federal home and community-based setting requirements, and
- 6. Have a diagnosis of substance use disorder, mental illness or brain injury

Eligible individuals will work with a Care Coordinator to develop an individualized plan of services, which may include the following:

- Training and Supports for Unpaid Caregivers
- Community Transitional Services
- Benefits Planning
- Non-Medical Transportation
- Respite
- Prevocational Training
- Supported Education
- Supported Employment
- Housing Support
- Family Peer Support
- Peer Support
