The Disability Determination Section delivers disability determinations to those applying for Social Security Disability Benefits



About Disability Determination Services

The Social Security disability program provides Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) and/ or Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits to persons with disabilities who are unable to work

100% federally funded	<pre># of disability decisions is determined by Social Security Admin (SSA)</pre>
Staff make medical disability determinations using SSA guidelines	 3 main claim levels: Initial claims Reconsideration claims Continuing Disability Reviews

Making disability determinations collaborating with Social Security, medical providers and claimants across the state, using 100% federal funds



DDS staff and contracted medical consultants review claims for medical evidence to make the disability determination	 Receives and reviews disability applications for benefit eligibility, sends to DDS to make the disability determination Handles the notification and appeals process for claimants Handles payment processes for those found disabled 	 Provide medical records for claimants to assist in the determination process Provide consultative examination services for those who need further medical evidence for the determination process 	Assist in the disability determination process by providing their medical source information, completing forms and attending consultative examinations



Who benefits from the Social Security Disability programs?


SSI

"To be eligible for SSI, beneficiaries must have low incomes, limited assets, and either be age 65 or older or have an impaired ability to work at a substantial gainful level as a result of significant disability."



SSDI

"Unlike SSI, there are no income or asset limits for SSDI eligibility. Instead, to qualify for SSDI, enrollees must have a sufficient work history (generally, 40 quarters) and meet the strict federal disability rules."




Primary reason (by body system) for initial claims for SSDI/SSI

North Dakota snapshot federal fiscal year 2022

- "The Listing of Impairments describes, for each major body system, impairments considered severe enough to prevent an individual from doing any gainful activity (or in the case of children under age 18 applying for SSI, severe enough to cause marked and severe functional limitations).
- "Most of the listed impairments are permanent or expected to result in death, or the listing includes a specific statement of duration.
- "For all other listings, the evidence must show that the impairment has lasted or is expected to last for a continuous period of at least 12 months.




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Overview of budget changes (IN MILLIONS)


INCREASE FROM BASE TO EXECUTIVE RECOMMENDATION **\$0.6 MILLION**
