Imagine losing everything and then having to rebuild in a new country with limited community connections, resources, and acceptance.


Our programs develop community collaborations to strengthen and guide newcomers as they become welcomed neighbors and valued contributors to the economy.

 All populations meeting Office of Refugee Resettlement eligibility criteria


 Neary 60% of arrivals are from Ukraine and Afghanistan

## Geographic Distribution of ND's Refugees



#### H.B. No. 1012

Resettle refugees in at least five geographically diverse communities in the state outside of the existing resettlement communities with a goal of resettling 25% of new refugees outside of existing resettlement communities.

Resettlement since July 2021: 290

Outside of Fargo: 41%




## Overview of budget changes (IN MILLIONS)
