# UPDATES – FEDERAL AND STATE

- Naloxone – OTC FDA approval

  - HB 1447 - Opioid Settlement Fund
    - First advisory council meeting was held on 2/9/2023
    - Advisory council meetings will be put on hold until after legislative session
  - SB 2248 - Mandatory term for imprisonment for manufacturing or delivering fentanyl
- ORN Naloxone training for UND students

# NALOXONE DISTRIBUTION ASSESSMENT – SUMMARY

- Based on the study “Estimating Naloxone Need in the United States Across Fentanyl, Heroin, and Prescription Opioid Epidemics: A Modelling Study Lancet Public Health, 2022” by MA Irvine, D Oller, J Boggis, B Bishop, D Coombs, E Wheeler, M Doe-Simkins, AY Walley, BDL Marshall, J Bratberg, TC Green, North Dakota has identified a need to distribute **7,810** units of naloxone
- As of 4/12/2023, **13,915** kits were distributed by BHD, LPHUs and the ONE Program.
