**Welcome and call to order:**

Christopher Joseph, Chair, called the meeting to order at 10:00 am CT.

**3/18/2025 meeting minutes review**

Jonathan Holth moved to approve the meeting minutes. Pamela Sagness seconded the motion. 6 in favor, 0 opposed.

**Opioid Settlement Updates**

Elin Alm with the ND Attorney General's office provided updates. The state has received \$26.5 million in settlement payments to date. The settlement with Purdue has been finalized. Subdivisions will have the opportunity to sign on to the Purdue settlement and the settlement with a second round of manufacturers. Elin clarified that the state should now expect to receive an estimated \$70 million over the course of 18 years versus the \$60 million previously estimated.

**Behavioral Health Division updates**

Amy Lies, Opioid Addiction Administrator with the ND Department of Health and Human Services Behavioral Health Division provided information regarding funding in the Opioid Settlement Fund, investment of funds, use of funds during the 2023-2025 biennium, and use of funds during the 2025-2027 biennium.

**Committee Discussion**

The committee discussed reaching out to the 2025-2027 Opioid Settlement Fund (OSF) grantees and have them present at upcoming meetings. The committee highlighted the importance of hearing from as many as possible before budget building and hearing from grantees implementing prevention in schools.

Pamela Sagness highlighted the 2025 Behavioral Health and Children & Family Services Conference in Bismarck October 20<sup>th</sup> – 23<sup>rd</sup>.
