PMHCA Program Purpose

Promote behavioral health integration in pediatric primary care in new or existing telehealth access programs.

Provide training and education to support the treatment of children and adolescents with behavioral disorders.

Support telehealth consultation and referral to a local pediatric behavioral health provider, to the extent possible.

Serve as a resource for pediatric primary care providers, psychiatrists, mental health professionals, and care coordinators.

Pediatric Mental Health Care Access Program

- ND HHS BHD was awarded a continuation three year HRSA grant to expand telebehavioral health services for children and youth within the state.
- The PMHCA grant was released by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), Maternal and Child Health Bureau (MCHB)
- The PMHCA grant was awarded from 2023-2026

Year 1: \$850,000 (20% cost match)

Year 2: \$858,000 (20% cost match)

Year 3: \$700,000 (20% cost match)


HSRI AIM 8: Continue to expand the use of Telebehavioral health

Goals

- 8.1 Increase the types of services available through tele-behavioral health
- 8.2 Enhance capacity of community providers to provide telebehavioral health services through education and awareness



PMHCA Program Goals



Goal 1:

Increase the capacity of primary care providers to screen, diagnose and treat children for behavioral health disorders in primary care settings.



PMHCA Program Updates-Community Grants

The PMHCA Community Grants will support integrated approaches to strengthen behavioral health care for youth by:

- Enhancing collaboration between primary care providers, behavioral health professionals and schools.
- Expanding access to training, consultation, and evidence-based tools for pediatric behavioral health.
- Promoting early identification and intervention for children and families.
- Reducing barriers to care, particularly in rural and underserved communities.

Goal 2:

Develop and create capacity for telehealth programs in communitybased settings by expanding partnerships within Emergency Departments and Schools.



PMHCA Program Updates

Current Activities to Achieve Goal:

- Through this partnership, CREA provides professional development and technical assistance to school staff in areas such as Check and Connect, CHAMPS, traumainformed practices, relationship building, Safe and Civil Schools, behavioral interventions and supports, and suicide prevention.
- In the 2024–2025 school year, grant funding supported the hiring of a Care Coordinator within Bismarck Public Schools and the purchase of Behavior Advantage, a positive behavior intervention planning system.
- Additionally, the PMHCA program will host six Project ECHO sessions open to all North Dakota school personnel. These sessions will offer free continuing education credits (CEUs) and focus on topics including trauma- and griefinformed care, suicide prevention in schools, and the power of parent engagement.



PMHCA Program Updates Continued

PMHCA will pilot Care Coordination in two rural school districts to provide families with comprehensive behavioral health and community support through:

- Family-centered assessment and goal setting
- Linking families to behavioral health and community resources
- Ongoing communication (with family consent) between Family Voices of North Dakota (FVND) and school staff
- Regular follow-up to promote student stability and family well-being

Providers are asked a few brief questions to identify the nature of the call and collect critical points about the patient. The collected information are forwarded to a Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist, who then call the Primary Care Provider back to provide free consultation on the case.
