

Project Overview

The overarching purpose of this project is to develop and expand the resources of the Treatment Collaborative for Traumatized Youth (TCTY) to address the significant gaps and improve access to evidence-based trauma services for Native American children across our highly rural state for the next 3 years. We propose to achieve this through training and delivery of culturally competent and evidence-based trauma treatments and training. The following goals and objectives have been developed to address our significant geography-related access gap and our lack of culturally sensitive trauma-informed mental health services for Native American youth.





Project Goals

Improve knowledge of trauma-informed care of Native American
Youth for professionals in child-serving systems in our region through education of trauma with Native American youth and communities

Project's Main Objectives

- 1. Develop a <u>trauma-informed care of Native American Youth training</u> and start delivering the presentations to **child-serving professionals**
- 2. Collaborate with Dr. Bigfoot to offer <u>Honoring Children</u>, <u>Mending the Circle</u> learning collaborative that provides training to **clinicians** in TF-CBT with Native American youth
- 3. Develop a clinician training on <u>Clinical Strategies to Incorporate Cultural Factors</u> and <u>Culture-related Process in Trauma Treatment with Native American youth</u>
- 4. Will engage in <u>community outreach with each tribal nation in ND</u> throughout the project to collaborate on tribal and cultural specific traumatic stress needs with youth
- 5. Increase access to culturally enhanced treatment to Native American youth, both in-office and over telehealth
