Call to Order. Greg Gallagher, Facilitator, called the business meeting of the BHPC Legislative Committee to order at 11:05 AM, CT.

Members Present. Brenda Bergsrud; Emma Quinn, Kurt Snyder, Teresa Larsen.

Facilitator. Greg Gallagher, The Consensus Council.

Legislative Committee Charge. Greg Gallagher provided background information regarding (a) the December 16, 2020, Committee meeting which defined the work and priorities of the Committee and (b) the December 29, 2020, and January 8, 2021, Committee meetings which reviewed select legislative issues, including the state hospital project. Members revisited the charge of the Legislative Committee, including (1) identifying prospective legislative initiatives aligned with the purpose of the BHPC; (2) monitoring legislative initiatives through the legislative process; (3) coordinating communications with BHPC members and facilitating effective BHPC input throughout the process; (4) soliciting the active participation of BHPC members; (5) drafting legislation that might advance the aims of the BHPC and the state's behavioral health strategic plan; and (6) empowering the BHPC Legislative Council, with full participation of the BHPC.

Approval of Agenda. Mr. Gallagher reviewed the meeting <u>agenda</u>. Members expressed satisfaction with the agenda and Mr. Gallagher recorded the committee's approval of the agenda.

Approval of Minutes. Mr. Gallagher reviewed the meeting minutes from the January 15, 2021, meeting of the BHPC Legislative Committee. Members expressed satisfaction with the January 15, 2021 meeting minutes. Mr. Gallagher recorded the committee's approval of the minutes.

Review of Department of Human Services Executive Budget, HB 1012

Legislative Summary GRID. Greg Gallagher presented the updated draft of the <u>Legislative</u> <u>Summary GRID</u> prepared by the Protection and Advocacy Project. Mr. Gallagher invited members to intersperse reports and comments on legislative matters transacted during the week, January 18-22, 2021, and anticipated legislative activity during the week, January 25-29, 2021. Members identified an interest to focus attention primarily on HB 1012, the DHS Executive Budget.

Members opened discussion on HB $\underline{1402}$, regarding the state's substance use disorder voucher program. Kurt Snyder provided an overview of the state SUD voucher program, including the

benefits and limits of the voucher program, given the voucher's definition, structure, services covered, and impact on facilities based on the number of beds. Members discussed the effect of the size of a facility on program eligibility. Members also discussed the range of effects of Medicaid coverage on the client and the provider, including the recently approved Medicaid 1915(i)program. Member examined the restrictive nature of program eligibility which makes the access of services problematic. Members identified a link with SB 2299. No specific action was recommended by the committee, at this time.

HB 1012. Members agreed that the BHPC is obligated to provide testimony regarding overall Department of Human Services funding, considering the systemic impact the DHS budget has on behavioral health services statewide. Based on previous agreements reached in two prior meetings, members have identified Brenda Bergsrud, BHPC Chair, and Emma Quinn, BHPC Vice Chair, to serve as leads in the preparation and delivery of BHPC testimony.

Members reaffirmed the four core budgetary principles the Committee established in its December 16, 2020, meeting, and all subsequent meetings:

- Protect Existing Programs from Possible Budget Cuts. Members expressed an interest to sustain, minimally, the state's current funding levels for behavioral health programming. Members identified a need to carefully review the forthcoming DHS budget to ascertain budget priorities, including the anticipated impact of reallocations brought on by the implementation of the state's Medicaid 1915(i) plan.
- Support of Medicaid Expansion. Members reiterated the BHPC's support for the continuation of the state's Medicaid Expansion program, as reaffirmed during the December 9, 2020, meeting of the BHPC. Members seek to remove any sunset clause to the state's Medicaid Expansion, securing a service safety net into the future.
- Establishing a Balance Between Substance Use and Mental Health Efforts. Members identified a need to establish a programmatic and budgetary balance that supports both substance use disorder and mental health initiatives, forestalling any inequitable redistribution of funds that might introduce disparity.
- Assessing the Balanced Use of Federal and State Funding. Members expressed a need to learn more about the manner in which DHS or other state agencies are optimizing the use of both federal and state funding and resisting any effort to transfer funding inordinately from state to federal responsibility. Both funding sources are important and should be optimally used.
- Support for State Hospital.

HB 1318, Seclusion and Restraint and; and HB 1089, Aversive Therapy. Teresa Larsen reported that she had submitted testimony, consistent with the committee's instructions on January 15, 2021, supporting the positions taken by the BHPC Legislative Committee regarding two separate

bills on seclusion and restraint (<u>HB 1318</u>) and aversive therapy (<u>HB 1089</u>). The BHPC positions on seclusion and restraint and aversive therapy are now on the record.

HB 1038, Legacy Fund Allocations. Teresa Larsen remarked that <u>HB 1038</u>, regarding the management of state Legacy Fund distributions, is currently being reviewed. Members expressed support for providing comments on the possible use of Legacy Funds to support the health and welfare of its citizens, especially predicated on workforce development, a provision specified in the bill. Members deferred further discussion on this bill to a later meeting.

Medical Marijuana Expanded to Recreational Use. Members discussed if the BHPC might go on record speaking in opposition to the expansion of medical marijuana into recreational marijuana. In the event an alternative approach might be required, the BHPC might consider seeking the addition of a recreational marijuana tax to accompany any program expansion, where generated tax revenue would be dedicated to the treatment of individuals. Members deferred further discussion on this bill to a later meeting.

Seeking a Balance Between Substance Use and Mental Health Priorities. Members agreed that any testimony given on behalf of the BHPC should clearly communicate a need for the state to strike a just balance of resources dedicated for both substance use and mental health programming. This principle should be emphasized in the BHPC testimony on HB 1012, to be delivered by Brenda Bergsrud and Emma Quinn.

Public Comment. Greg Gallagher opened the public comment period of the meeting and invited any interested individuals to provide testimony. No individuals stepped forward to provide comment.

The BHPC Legislative Committee agreed to meet again on Friday, January 29, 2021, at 11:00 AM, CT, to continue its work.

Adjournment. Having complete the stated aims of the meeting, Chairperson Bergsrud called the meeting adjourned.

The meeting adjourned at 12:03 PM, CT.
