## Friday, February 12, 2021 11:00 AM, CT

**Call to Order.** Greg Gallagher, Facilitator, called the business meeting of the BHPC Legislative Committee to order at 11:07 AM, CT.

Members Present. Emma Quinn and Teresa Larsen.

Facilitator. Greg Gallagher, The Consensus Council.

Legislative Committee Charge. Greg Gallagher provided background information published within the February 5, 2021, committee minutes outlining the committee's responsibilities, including (1) identifying prospective legislative initiatives aligned with the purpose of the BHPC; (2) monitoring legislative initiatives through the legislative process; (3) coordinating communications with BHPC members and facilitating effective BHPC input throughout the process; (4) soliciting the active participation of BHPC members; (5) drafting legislation that might advance the aims of the BHPC and the state's behavioral health strategic plan; and (6) empowering the BHPC Legislative Council, with full participation of the BHPC Executive Committee, to transact legislative activities that support the aims of the BHPC.

**Approval of Agenda.** Mr. Gallagher reviewed the meeting <u>Agenda</u>. Members expressed satisfaction with the agenda and Mr. Gallagher recorded the committee's approval of the agenda.

**Approval of Minutes.** Mr. Gallagher reviewed the meeting minutes from the February 5, 2021, meeting of the BHPC Legislative Committee. Members expressed satisfaction with the February 5, 2021 meeting minutes. Mr. Gallagher recorded the committee's approval of the minutes.

Review of Department of Human Services Executive Budget, HB 1012

**Legislative Summary GRID**. Greg Gallagher placed into the record the updated draft of the <u>Legislative Summary GRID</u> prepared by the Protection and Advocacy Project.

**HB 1038, Legacy Fund Allocations**. <u>HB 1038</u> currently is presented as a study resolution. Members restated their support for waiting until the bill passes to the Senate side before preparing testimony in support of the study resolution, which currently appears headed for passage.

**HB 1012: DHS Executive Budget.** There was little overt action this week regarding the DHS executive budget. Members will continue to monitor the progress of the bill in the committee.

**Medical and Recreational Marijuana.** Members restated their interest in following any legislation that might move into a second chamber. The BHPC might provide testimony at that time to seek a user tax with revenue gained to support addiction treatment or other behavioral health initiatives, as discussed at previous BHPC Legislative Committee meetings.

**HCR 3022, Hospital Discharge Database.** Members reaffirmed their interest in observing and monitoring the progress of this resolution on the House side and then to prepare any testimony on the Senate side, should the resolution pass over.

**SB 2311, Mental Health and Suicide Prevention.** Members noted that during this past week <u>SB 2311</u> had undergone a substantial rewrite. The current version calls for an interim study of the state's K-12 academic content standards to ensure that the standards reflect best practices for mental health promotion and prevention content, including suicide prevention. The span of content review has been expanded beyond grades 7-12 to now encompass grades K-12. Members expressed support for the changes made in SB 2311 and will continue to monitor its progress. Members may consider proposing amendments to the bill following crossover that introduce a requirement for school districts to submit evidence of compliance, reporting the inclusion of mental health and suicide prevention instruction to the State Superintendent.

**Providing Technical Assistance and Navigation Support to Providers Regarding Medicaid Applications and Management.** Members revisited comments made during the February 5, 2020, committee meeting under the heading *SUD Voucher practices* and suggested a reframing of the support required by many providers who apply for or manage reimbursements within the Medicaid ecosystem.

Members observed that many newer providers seeking an approved status to bill for Medicaid-covered services may be ill-prepared for the complexity and duration of the Medicaid reimbursement system. Many providers may encounter unexpected cashflow impacts resulting from the protracted delays providers encounter within the reimbursement system. Members discussed whether the state might improve overall provider success by establishing a technical assistance system built around a provider-Navigator program designed to train, support, and retain service providers within the state's Medicaid service system. In such a system, the DHS might issue, through a state-funded program, RFPs to solicit proposals from established technical assistance organizations to act as provider Navigators. These Navigators would assist service providers in simplifying and perhaps assuming service reimbursement duties, on behalf of providers. Members entertained the possibility of the BHPC proposing such a study that might be included within an existing bill, or perhaps the DHS Executive Budget. Members will examine this proposal further at the next committee meeting.

Members requested that Greg Gallagher meet with Kurt Snyder to draft directions to the DHS that might be forwarded to the HRD to begin a navigation initiative during the 2021-2023 biennium.

**SUD and Mental Health Equity Funding.** Members expressed satisfaction with BHPC's position on seeking an equitable funding of mental health and SUD state initiatives. This testimony was presented before the House Appropriations Committee – Human Resources Division during its recent testimony, presented within the January 29, 2021, meeting minutes. The committee will continue to monitor the HRD's budget formation approach.

**1115 Waiver for SUD.** Members elected to set aside any further discussion on the 1115 Waiver for SUD since it must also involve adopting an IMD waiver exclusion, a matter oF considerable complexity that lies far outside any possible action during this current legislative session. Members recommended that this issue be brought forward before the BHPC for a thorough airing. Dr. Rosalie Etherington and Caprice Knapp may serve as good resources for this future discussion.

**Mental Health Block Grant.** Members introduced discussion on the current standing and management of the Mental Health Block Grant. Members expressed their frustration regarding the opaque nature of the

Block Grant's management. Members supported advancing the Block Grant as a BHPC agenda item, spanning several meetings, exploring its foundational purposes, funding structure, state-selected priorities, and history of funding commitments.

**Adjournment.** Having completed the work of the committee, Greg Gallagher adjourned the meeting 11:47 AM, CT.
