#### Behavioral Health Planning Council Legislative Committee

#### Friday, February 5, 2021 11:00 AM, CT

**Call to Order.** Greg Gallagher, Facilitator, called the business meeting of the BHPC Legislative Committee to order at 11:04 AM, CT.

Members Present. Brenda Bergsrud; Emma Quinn, Kurt Snyder, and Teresa Larsen.

Facilitator. Greg Gallagher, The Consensus Council.

Legislative Committee Charge. Greg Gallagher provided background information published within the January 29, 2021, committee minutes outlining the committee's responsibilities, including (1) identifying prospective legislative initiatives aligned with the purpose of the BHPC; (2) monitoring legislative initiatives through the legislative process; (3) coordinating communications with BHPC members and facilitating effective BHPC input throughout the process; (4) soliciting the active participation of BHPC members; (5) drafting legislation that might advance the aims of the BHPC and the state's behavioral health strategic plan; and (6) empowering the BHPC Legislative Council, with full participation of the BHPC Executive Committee, to transact legislative activities that support the aims of the BHPC.

**Approval of Agenda.** Mr. Gallagher reviewed the meeting <u>Agenda</u>. Members expressed satisfaction with the agenda and Mr. Gallagher recorded the committee's approval of the agenda.

**Approval of Minutes.** Mr. Gallagher reviewed the meeting minutes from the January 29, 2021, meeting of the BHPC Legislative Committee. Members expressed satisfaction with the January 29, 2021 meeting minutes. Mr. Gallagher recorded the committee's approval of the minutes.

**Legislative Summary GRID**. Greg Gallagher presented the updated draft of the <u>Legislative Summary GRID</u> prepared by the Protection and Advocacy Project. Mr. Gallagher invited members to intersperse reports and comments on legislative matters transacted during the week, February 1-5, 2021, and anticipated legislative activity during the week, February 8-12, 2021.

HB 1038, Legacy Fund Allocations. Teresa Larsen remarked that HB 1038, regarding the management of state Legacy Fund distributions, is currently being reviewed. Members had previously expressed support for providing comments on the possible use of Legacy Funds to support the health and welfare of its citizens, especially predicated on workforce development, a provision specified in the bill. Ms. Larsen recommended that the BHPC participate in any interim legislative study during the 2021-2023 biennium, assuming the passage of the bill, which currently evidences strong interest among legislators. At an appropriate time, the BHPC might provide supportive testimony regarding the use of Legacy Funds for the most fiscally at-risk goals within the state's behavioral health strategic plan, for workforce development behavioral health supports, or for other emergent needs. Members supported a strategy of waiting until

the bill passes to the Senate side before preparing testimony in support of the study components of the bill.

**HB 1012: DHS Executive Budget.** Members discussed the collective testimony provided by various stakeholders regarding HB 1012. The House Appropriations Committee – Human Resources Division has largely completed hearing from DHS divisions this past week and will be moving forward to amend the budget, including the insertion of any directive provisions. Members will continue to monitor the progress of the bill in the committee.

**Medical and Recreational Marijuana.** Members discussed current work on several bills listed on the <u>Legislative Summary GRID</u> concerning medical and recreational marijuana. Members stated an interest in following any legislation that might move into a second chamber. The BHPC might provide testimony to seek a user tax with revenue gained to support addiction treatment or other behavioral health initiatives, as discussed at previous BHPC Legislative Committee meetings.

HCR 3022, Hospital Discharge Database. Members discussed the impact of HCR 3022 to consider studying the feasibility and desirability of implementing a hospital discharge database. Members focused attention on possible patient privacy concerns and ascertaining the purpose and application of any data collection and reporting effort, including whether any data collection might include individuals under care for mental health treatment. Members favored observing and monitoring the progress of this resolution on the House side and then to prepare any testimony on the Senate side, should the resolution pass over.

**SB 2311, Mental Health and Suicide Prevention.** Members discussed <u>SB 2311</u> concerning mental health and suicide prevention instruction for students in grades 7 – 12. Members favored supporting any effort to integrate mental health instruction and suicide prevention within the schools' curricula. The state's current <u>health content standards</u>, broad expectations for what a student should know and be able to do, provide general guidance regarding mental health awareness but do not address more specific issues, such as suicide prevention. Members considered whether the BHPC might provide a broad statement of support for the bill or, perhaps, propose amendments to the bill that introduce a requirement for school districts to submit evidence of compliance, reporting the inclusion of mental health and suicide prevention instruction to the State Superintendent. Members elected to discuss this matter further at the next meeting, following additional research on the bill.

Substance Use Disorder Voucher. Members expressed concerns, previously raised, that the state may be moving in the direction of reducing state-funded programs with the unrealistic prospect of Medicaid 1915(i) providing sufficient service coverage, especially since it is driven by more restrictive eligibility rules. Members observed that many newer providers seeking an approved status to bill for Medicaid-covered services may be ill-prepared for the complexity and duration of the Medicaid reimbursement system. Many providers may encounter unexpected cashflow impacts resulting from the protracted delays within the reimbursement system. Members discussed whether the state might improve overall provider success by establishing a technical assistance system built around a provider-Navigator program designed to train, support, and retain service providers within the state's Medicaid service system. In such a system, the DHS might issue, through a state-funded program, RFPs to solicit proposals from established technical assistance organizations to act as provider Navigators. These Navigators would assist service providers in simplifying and perhaps assuming service reimbursement duties, on behalf of providers. Members entertained the possibility of the BHPC proposing such a study that might be included within an existing bill, or perhaps the DHS Executive Budget. Members will examine this proposal further at the next committee meeting.

**SUD** and Mental Health Equity Funding. Members observed that recent testimony provided by a variety of presenters indicates sufficient concern across stakeholders to secure an equitable level of funding for SUD and mental health programming. The BHPC has gone on record raising its concern to the House Appropriations Committee – Human Resources Division during its recent testimony, presented within the January 29, 2021, meeting minutes.

**1115 Waiver for SUD.** Members observed that during the past week the HRD heard comments on a possible 1115 Waiver for SUD. Members expressed an interest in exploring this technical matter further at the next committee meeting.

**Adjournment.** Having completed the work of the committee, Greg Gallagher adjourned the meeting 12:02 PM, CT.
