Call to Order. Greg Gallagher, Facilitator, called the business meeting of the BHPC Legislative Committee to order at 11:04 AM, CT.

Members Present. Emma Quinn, Carlotta McCleary and Teresa Larsen.

Facilitator. Greg Gallagher, The Consensus Council.

Legislative Committee Charge. Greg Gallagher provided background information published within the March 5, 2021, committee minutes outlining the committee's responsibilities, including (1) identifying prospective legislative initiatives aligned with the purpose of the BHPC; (2) monitoring legislative initiatives through the legislative process; (3) coordinating communications with BHPC members and facilitating effective BHPC input throughout the process; (4) soliciting the active participation of BHPC members; (5) drafting legislation that might advance the aims of the BHPC and the state's behavioral health strategic plan; and (6) empowering the BHPC Legislative Council, with full participation of the BHPC Executive Committee, to transact legislative activities that support the aims of the BHPC.

Approval of Agenda. Mr. Gallagher reviewed the March 12, 2021, meeting <u>Agenda.</u> Teresa Larsen requested that an item for peer support be added to the agenda. Members expressed satisfaction with the amended agenda. Mr. Gallagher noted the addition of "peer support" following "consideration of select bills," and recorded the committee's approval of the amended agenda.

Approval of Minutes. Mr. Gallagher reviewed the minutes from the March 5, 2021, BHPC Legislative Committee meeting. Members expressed satisfaction with the meeting minutes and Mr. Gallagher recorded the committee's approval of the minutes

Mr. Gallgher noted the prior distribution of the Protection and Advocacy's <u>GRID Report</u>. Members offered general comments on the week's legislative activities and elected to focus on a limited number of specific topics, continuing discussions from the March 5, 2021, Committee meeting.

Experienced Parents Program. Members noted that during public testimony during the past week, presenters had identified the significantly negative impact in funding cuts for Part C early intervention, supportive family programs, specifically the Experienced Parent Program, totaling approximately \$260,000, representing federal and state match funding. Presenters had commented that this area required specific attention and correction in the DHS budget. Committee members appeared optimistic that the Senate Appropriations Committee, based on their reactions, appeared ready to mitigate these cuts.

Consideration for SB 2089, Autism Voucher Program. Committee members observed that during testimony before the House Human Services Committee the Department of Human Services appeared to remain resolute it its opposition to the continuation of the Autism Voucher Program. Members noted that testimony provided by Holly Johnson, on behalf of the ASD Task Force, appeared to effectively connect with the House Committee members, indicating the House Committee's interest in addressing the voucher program cuts. Autism services appear caught between the recorded interest of the Senate to restore ~\$300,000 in voucher funding and the recorded interest of the House Appropriations Committee to remove the \$1.1 Million in state funding, producing a potential showdown in the direction of state voucher funding. Members discussed the historical development of the Autism Voucher Program and the different manner in which autism services have been perceived and managed within the Department of Human Services, over time.

Members discussed a potential initiative by the BHPC to advance, as an element of the state's behavioral health strategic plan, standards of functional care or fidelity of implementation monitoring across all behavioral health disciplines, with a principal concern for autism services, given the current state of uncertainty regarding its direction. Members expressed strong support to integrate program performance indicators within overall program goals.

Peer Support Programming. Members discussed initiatives enacted during the 2019 Legislative Session to enhance peer support programming for both Medicaid 1915(i) eligible and non-eligible individuals. Although certain funding (~\$304,000 federal and state match funding) and a limited 0.5 FTE allocation were authorized, there appears to be limited movement to implement these initiatives. The Committee will conduct additional research regarding the standing of this funding and program implementation.

Members discussed recent efforts to form a statewide association of peer support professionals. Mental Health America has been sponsoring certification for peer support personnel.

BHPC Testimony Regarding HB 1012. Members requested that Emma Quinn contact Brenda Bergsrud to confirm the submission of formal BHPC testimony on HB 1012 to the Senate Appropriations Committee. Members sought to ensure that the BHPC's testimony submitted on the House side will likewise be submitted on the Senate side.

At the request of the Committee members, Mr. Gallagher compiled the list of bills and initiatives that the BHPC Legislative Committee has tracked, to date, with the intent for the Committee to reassess priorities during the March 19, 2021, Committee meeting.
