Behavioral Health Planning Council Legislative Committee

Call to Order. Greg Gallagher, Facilitator, called the business meeting of the BHPC Legislative Committee to order at 11:08 AM, CT.

Members Present. Brenda Bergsrud, Emma Quinn, Kurt Snyder, and Teresa Larsen.

Facilitator. Greg Gallagher, The Consensus Council.

Legislative Committee Charge. Greg Gallagher provided background information outlining the committee's responsibilities, including (1) identifying prospective legislative initiatives aligned with the purpose of the BHPC; (2) monitoring legislative initiatives through the legislative process; (3) coordinating communications with BHPC members and facilitating effective BHPC input throughout the process; (4) soliciting the active participation of BHPC members; (5) drafting legislation that might advance the aims of the BHPC and the state's behavioral health strategic plan; and (6) empowering the BHPC Legislative Council, with full participation of the BHPC Executive Committee, to transact legislative activities that support the aims of the BHPC.

Approval of Agenda. Mr. Gallagher reviewed the March 26, 2021, meeting <u>Agenda.</u> Members expressed satisfaction with the agenda. Mr. Gallagher recorded the committee's approval of the agenda, as presented.

Approval of Minutes. Mr. Gallagher reviewed the minutes from the March 19, 2021, BHPC Legislative Committee meeting. Members expressed satisfaction with the meeting minutes and Mr. Gallagher recorded the committee's approval of the minutes, as presented.

Review of Legislative Calendar, March 22-26, 2021

Review of Department of Human Services Executive Budget, HB 1012

Mr. Gallagher noted the prior distribution of the Protection and Advocacy's <u>GRID Report</u>. Members offered general comments on the week's legislative activities and elected to focus discussions on a limited number of specific topics, focusing attention on the DHS Executive Budget, the State Hospital proposal, Peer Support, the ASD Voucher, and the SUD Voucher.

Support for a New State Hospital. Members noted that the BHPC has previously endorsed the proposal to build a new State Hospital and had testified in support of it on the House side. Emma Quinn and Brenda Berrgsrud have worked to prepare the Senate testimony. Ms. Bergsrud will submit the BHPC's letter of support for the State Hospital to the Senate Appropriations Committee members. BHPC members observed that Senate Appropriations Committee members have expressed differing expressions of support for the proposal during the 2021-2023 biennium, with the possibility that the proposal may move toward a study in preparation for the 2023 Legislative Assembly. Members underscored the importance of submitting the BHPC's letter of support at this time.

HB 1012, DHS Executive Budget: Inclusion of Grant Writer FTE within DHS. Members revisited discussions begun during the March 19 meeting to address the evident need for the DHS Behavioral Health Division to add an FTE for a grant writer to support Aim 12 within the state's behavioral health strategic plan. Members have previously weighed the option of seeking either an FTE or additional operating funds to support a grant contractor, but had elected to pursue the FTE option, at this point. Members noted that DHS had not yet responded to member inquiries regarding the best way to proceed with this proposal. Teresa Larsen volunteered to meet with Senator Dever to press the case that a grant writer be included within the DHS budget.

Peer Support. Members revisited discussions begun during the March 19 meeting regarding the standing of peer support services, especially peer support for non-eligible Medicaid 1915(i) individuals. Members previously reviewed recent efforts to support funding for statewide behavioral health services, as set forth within Aim 12 of the state's behavioral health strategic plan. Teresa Larsen, designated Aim 12 BHPC liaison, is working with Bevin Croft and DHS to include a comprehensive approach to statewide funding.

There is an interest to add peer support services for non-eligible Medicaid 1915(i) individuals, including discussions within DHS. The original 2021 DHS budget was classified as a base budget, including certain Optional Adjustment Requests (OAR) for peer support. Research is ongoing whether peer support services approved during the 2019-2021 Session are to be considered as a proper component of a base budget, since inclusion in a base budget would evidence the state's commitment for peer support services.

Members reasserted their concerns that additional information and discussion was required to explore the prospects of expanding peer support services within the state's Medicaid plan. To date, DHS has not provided clarification regarding the status of the OAR for peer support, leaving a question whether peer support services are understood to be a priority for the state. Members observed that, based on their best recollection, other states have been providing peer support services for many years. Teresa Larsen offered to meet with Senator Dever to inquire into a means to move peer support services forward as an expectation for the state.

SB 2089 - ASD Voucher and Supporting HB 1012 Fiscal Note. During the March 19 meeting, Committee members expressed support for advancing amendments for both SB 2089 and HB 1012 that would ensure full funding of the ASD Voucher Program and related program improvements. Teresa Larsen and Emma Quinn did submit a letter of support of full funding for the ASD Voucher within HB 1012.

Support for SUD Voucher. Members discussed the need for the legislature to support funding for the SUD Voucher Program but raised concerns over the manner in which the voucher payments may be directed exclusively to IMD facilities, resulting in an inequitable distribution of financial support for other facilities within the state.

Member agreed to draft a letter of both support for the SUD Voucher Program and concern over the manner of administering the program. Members structured a <u>working draft</u> of a support letter which would present a general tone of measured support:

The Council supports HB1012 and has provided testimony on various issues and topics throughout this session. More recently, the Council has decided it needs to address the SUD Voucher. The Council supports the SUD Voucher, and we are grateful to the legislature for funding the gaps and underserved needs of the North Dakotans with SUD issues.

However, when reviewing the funding distributions of last biennium, it was clear that a large portion of the funding was going to two facilities that are considered IMDs. The Council understands these facilities in Fargo have a large population base and the need for residential care is significant. The Council is also aware that there are now two additional IMDs that are looking to be funded through the SUD Voucher. When the Council considers that when a Medicaid-eligible individual is a patient in an IMD, he or she cannot receive Medicaid coverage for services provided inside or outside the IMD, we are concerned about adding additional IMDs.

Therefore, the Council is recommending a moratorium restricting any new IMD residential beds until a study is completed to determine the impact of adding additional IMDs to the SUD Voucher program.

Members expressed support for this structured statement of support and assigned Brenda Bergsrud with the responsibility of forwarding this statement to Senator Dever.

Public Comments. No members of the public were in attendance and no comments were submitted.

Adjournment. Having completed the work of the committee, Greg Gallagher adjourned the meeting at 12:11 PM, CT.

SUD Voucher Support Draft

March 26, 2021

Chair Dever and Members of the Senate Appropriations subcommittee,

The ND Behavioral Health Planning Council is a 30-member Governor appointed board whose objective is to monitor, review, and evaluate the allocation and adequacy of mental health and substance abuse services in North Dakota. The Council serves in an advisory role to the North Dakota Division of Behavioral Health on both the mental health and substance use block grants. In addition, the Council serves as a steering committee for implementation of the ND Health Services Research Institute (HSRI) plan to address the behavioral health needs of the citizens of ND.

The Council supports HB1012 and has provided testimony on various issues and topics throughout this session. More recently, the Council has decided it needs to address the SUD Voucher. The Council supports the SUD Voucher, and we are grateful to the legislature for funding the gaps and underserved needs of the North Dakotans with SUD issues.

However, when reviewing the funding distributions of last biennium, it was clear that a large portion of the funding was going to two facilities that are considered IMDs. The Council understands these facilities in Fargo have a large population base and the need for residential care is significant. The Council is also aware that there are now two additional IMDs that are looking to be funded through the SUD Voucher. When the Council considers that when a Medicaid-eligible individual is a patient in an IMD, he or she cannot receive Medicaid coverage for services provided inside or outside the IMD, we are concerned about adding additional IMDs.

Therefore, the Council is recommending a moratorium restricting any new IMD residential beds until a study is completed to determine the impact of adding additional IMDs to the SUD Voucher program.

To be clear, the Council supports the SUD Voucher and the full implementation of the recommendations of the HSRI study. ND has serious behavioral health needs which require ongoing funding and support from the state of North Dakota. However, we also support strategic and sustainable approaches to developing the full continuum of care for the citizens of ND.
