## Behavioral Health Planning Council Legislative Committee

# Friday, April 9, 2021 11:00 AM, CT

**Call to Order.** Greg Gallagher, Facilitator, called the business meeting of the BHPC Legislative Committee to order at 11:05 AM, CT.

Members Present. Brenda Bergsrud, Kurt Snyder, Carlotta McCleary, and Teresa Larsen.

BHPC Attendees. Brad Hawk and Tami Conrad.

Facilitator. Greg Gallagher, The Consensus Council.

**Legislative Committee Charge.** Greg Gallagher provided background information outlining the committee's responsibilities, including (1) identifying prospective legislative initiatives aligned with the purpose of the BHPC; (2) monitoring legislative initiatives through the legislative process; (3) coordinating communications with BHPC members and facilitating effective BHPC input throughout the process; (4) soliciting the active participation of BHPC members; (5) drafting legislation that might advance the aims of the BHPC and the state's behavioral health strategic plan; and (6) empowering the BHPC Legislative Council, with full participation of the BHPC Executive Committee, to transact legislative activities that support the aims of the BHPC.

Approval of Agenda. Mr. Gallagher reviewed the April 9, 2021, meeting Agenda.

**Approval of Minutes.** Mr. Gallagher reviewed the minutes from the March 26, 2021, BHPC Legislative Committee meeting.

# Review of Legislative Calendar, April 5-9, 2021 Review of Legislative Calendar, April 12-16, 2021 Review of Department of Human Services Executive Budget, HB 1012

Mr. Gallagher noted the prior distribution of the Protection and Advocacy's <u>GRID Report</u>. Members offered general comments on the week's legislative activities and elected to focus discussions on the imminent transition of legislative activities to conference committees, itemizing issues of emergent concern, and establishing a lead group of BHPC representatives who would assume principal leadership in communicating with legislative conference committees.

Members noted that the full Senate Appropriations Committee will now manage all HB 1012 activities, following the completion of the subcommittee's activity. It appears that the Senate conferees for HB 1012 will be Senators Dever, Mathern, and Hogue. The House conferees is not yet known. The Senate's final amendments to HB 1012 is expected to be released later on April 9, 2021. These amendments will become the foundation for discussions moving forward to the House and ultimately the HB 1012 conference committee.

Members stated their desire to streamline any BHPC recommendations, going forward, to a limited number of bills with summary statements of desired outcomes, forming the basis for any communications with conference committee members. The BHPC Legislative Committee reaffirmed its position statements for the various bills discussed throughout the session. Certain late developments from the Senate Appropriations Committee require the BHPC to reassert its position to legislators, specifically members of the forthcoming HB 1012 conference committee.

#### BHPC Position Statements.

BHPC Reasserts its Support for a Restrictive Moratorium on SUD Vouchers by IMDs. Members revisited their discussions from the March 26, 2021, meeting outlining the need for the legislature to support funding for the SUD Voucher Program but raising concerns over the manner in which the voucher payments may be directed exclusively to IMD facilities, resulting in an inequitable distribution of financial support for other facilities within the state.

Members reaffirmed the BHPC letter that both supported the SUD Voucher Program and expressed concern over the manner of administering the program:

The Council supports HB1012 and has provided testimony on various issues and topics throughout this session. More recently, the Council has decided it needs to address the SUD Voucher. The Council supports the SUD Voucher, and we are grateful to the legislature for funding the gaps and underserved needs of the North Dakotans with SUD issues.

However, when reviewing the funding distributions of last biennium, it was clear that a large portion of the funding was going to two facilities that are considered IMDs. The Council understands these facilities in Fargo have a large population base and the need for residential care is significant. The Council is also aware that there are now two additional IMDs that are looking to be funded through the SUD Voucher. When the Council considers that when a Medicaid-eligible individual is a patient in an IMD, <u>he or she cannot receive Medicaid coverage for services provided inside or outside the IMD</u>, we are concerned about adding additional IMDs.

# Therefore, the Council is recommending a moratorium restricting any new IMD residential beds until a study is completed to determine the impact of adding additional IMDs to the SUD Voucher program.

Members observed an interest among Senate Appropriations Committee members to restrict the allocation of SUD Voucher funding for treatment institutions based on the number of beds in the institutions, opening greater access to the SUD Voucher program statewide.

Support for a New State Hospital. Members reaffirmed the BHPC's endorsement of the proposal to build a new State Hospital. Recent discussions within the Senate Appropriations Committee appear to be moving toward an intensive study of State Hospital options, supported with a \$3 Million appropriation, with the intent of developing architectural plans that would be presented to the 2023 Legislative Assembly, predicated on the prospects of quick legislative approval and the speedy initiation of construction immediately following the 2023 Session. Some discussion involves developing a balance of regional facilities and a central state facility. The BHPC supports any effort to move the State Hospital construction plans forward.

Members expressed concern regarding the stated interest of certain legislators to seek IMD waivers to support services from certain institutions. Members reiterated the long-standing support of the BHPC for home- and community-based services and de-emphasizing larger institutional care. Any waiver strategy

would require a cost-neutral solution, which would effectively transfer financial resources to larger institutions, undercutting the broader policy aim of localized treatment options.

The members restated the BHPC position opposing any IMD waiver proposal, without further extensive study. Members stated that the BHPC should adopt its own study of treatment options across the range of institutions with varying bed capacity and its impact on the broader HCBS policy aim. This BHPC study should be a top priority for the 2021-2023 biennium.

Support for Inclusion of Grant Writer FTE within DHS. Members reaffirmed their support to add an FTE within the Behavioral Health Division of DHS for a grant writer to support Aim 12 within the state's behavioral health strategic plan. Members noted that there appears support for this additional FTE among Appropriation Committee members.

*Permanent Supportive Housing Grants.* Members expressed support for sustaining permanent supportive housing grants designed to support individuals in securing housing and accessing recovery-oriented and person-centered program services.

*Eliminating Sunset Clause for Medicaid Expansion.* Members reaffirmed the long-standing BHPC position that the Medicaid Expansion Sunset Clause should be eliminated, securing Medicaid support services for more state residents and removing any prospects of limited- or uncertain-service coverage.

BHPC Legislative Committee Representatives. Members selected Teresa Larsen, Carlotta McCleary, and Kurt Snyder to act jointly in communicating the BHPC's policy positions to the various conferees appointed to negotiate the final resolution of HB 1012. Members encouraged the BHPC representatives to act proactively within the spirit of the policy aims articulated by the BHPC throughout its discussions.

Public Comments. No members of the public were in attendance and no comments were submitted.

**Adjournment.** Having completed the work of the committee, Greg Gallagher adjourned the meeting at 12:05 PM, CT.

**Next BHPC Legislative Committee Meeting:** No future meeting date was set. Any future meeting will be at the call of the BHPC Representatives responsible for the HB 1012 conference committee.
