Welcome: MFP Program Administrator Kayla Trzpuc – presented opening poll

- •Life Skills and Transition Center Updates
 - Given by Keith Vavrovsky. SW from Life Skills Transition center. Report on population. 46 individuals living there 32 adults and 14 youth. 2 discharges and 2 admissions – 1 a youth from Fargo and an adult from Grand Forks. They continue to have movement of about 5-6 people. 4 more will move out this summer.
 - Everyone who lives there strives to have an open referral on the DD section system. Close to 90% of their people are on this system to help get them moved.
 - They do a regional referral now where individuals can present themselves to private support. They have done this for about 5-6 years. They are trying to move this State-wide.
 - There were no questions.

•Developmental Disability Section Updates

- Given by Katie Bentz.
- House Bill 1012 was HHS budget, and they were impacted by this.
- Guardianships were transferred to a separate place.
- Provider inflation of 2%
- Project to convert current ICAP, it is not being updated.
- Autism waiver had age increased to 20 years of age.
- SS income is being disregarded
- HB1109 changes to terminology. Definitions were changed.
- HB 1485 relating to person needs allowance, increased by \$15 a month and is to be reviewed annually based on inflation.
- SB 2029 guardianship bill. Taking over guardianship contracts and all funds by June 30, 2027.

- SB 2029 state alert system Included a change to silver alert to include DD persons.
- SB 2112 related to admissions to LSTC of minors. Expires 06/30/2027.
- SB 2291 related to guardianship for those guardianships which are terminated can be extended. Some definitions were changed. Added some sections.
- SB 2305 caregiver changes
- •Children's Waiver updates
 - Updated given by Kat Barchenger waiver administrator.
 - Medical Fragile and Autism waivers will be changing ages up to 21st birthdate.
 - Tomorrow is the cut off for the cross disabilities waiver advisory council.
 - Changes to Level of Care for cross disabilities waiver advisory council.
 - Looking for 15 individuals for LOC or cross disabilities waiver advisory council. Go to counsel website and click HHS link to find application.
 - A person would serve on the advisory council for two years.
 - Hoping to have the waivers out for public comment in June with a November 1 start date for the waiver.
- •Medicaid Legislative Updates
 - Update given by Brendan Joyce
 - Discussed who is covered by North Dakota Medicaid. 50% are children.
 - Medicaid Expansion is 25%
 - People with disabilities 10%
 - 1 in 7 North Dakotan's are on Medicaid. 52.5% of SNF individuals are being paid for by Medicaid. 34% of children in ND are on CHIP (Medicaid)
 - Budget was discussed. Majority of dollars, 97% is paid to providers for services. 1% is for administration.
 - Enrollment and Expenditures were discussed along with key budgets drivers. (FMAP, Populations, Drugs, Federal Mandates)
 - Goals for next biennium: Bend cost curve, deliver whole person care. Promote sustainability and value, improve the member and provider experience.
 - Highlighted Governor's budget recommendations listed on PowerPoint, along with legislative actions per budget bills which were also touched on.
 - Studies and Reports involving Medicaid were explained.
 - Question What is Value based purchasing? Value based purchasing is where you try to tie what you purchase with outcomes. Examples were given.
 - Question Is there a time frame for studies? Answer: there isn't a time frame yet. Can see the bills here: <u>https://ndlegis.gov/sites/default/files/resource/committee-</u> memorandum/27.9003.02000.pdf
 - Adult and Aging Services Updates

- Update given by Nancy Nikolas Maier.
- Overview of HB 1012 along with other legislation was completed as highlighted by PowerPoint used during meeting. (See PowerPoint)
- QSP's will get a rate increase on 07/01/2025 along with 07/01/2026 as well. Rate increase is 2%.
- Guardianship money will be moved out of Adult and Aging budget
- Discussed by Kayla Trzpuc MFP Program Administrator, per PowerPoint: ND is working towards being the healthiest state. Discussed delivering best in class customer centered experiences. Discussed guiding principles. Discussed the Statewide data hub.
- Introductions of MFP and TDP staff were completed.
- Statistics per the TDP and MFP programs were detailed.
- MFP Facts were discussed per the PowerPoint used including supplemental services where the federal grant pays for 100% of the expenses.
- Population group ages were discussed. Elderly (65 years of age), physical disability (18-64), development disabilities (18 and older), and children (under the age of 18).
- One of our markers are to transition a person within 120 days of signing a consent, if it is safe. Strive is for safety before timeliness.
- Benchmarks were discussed along with the resources and our sister program the North Dakota Transition and Diversion Program.
- Work plan and semi-annual report was discussed as highlighted by PowerPoint.
- Capacity funding projects are being extended in some cases.
- Meeting dates for 2025 were listed on the PowerPoint.
- North Dakota Transition and Diversion Program
 - This was discussed during Nancy Nikolas Maier's presentation.
- Adult Foster Care Workgroup
 - Updates given by Kathryn Good Nurse Administrator with Adult and Aging.
 - Legislation was discussed as shown on PowerPoint. Bullet points were discussed.
 - Workgroup meeting schedules were highlighted. Looking at other State models to make sure nothing is missed.

- Housing partner updates
 - Updated given by Cheryl Merck State housing facilitator with the program since 2011. Staff is throughout the whole State.

- Tuesday training's have been going on since mid-April. Names of trainings were given.
- They were able to assist 60 individuals from a University Drive Manor shut down. There are a lot of good stories derived from this experience.
- Referrals keep coming.
- The housing incentive fund was approved. This was created with a group to get money set aside to build units for low income or disabilities. \$25 million was in the budget for this.
- HIF fund is contributing with other projects.
- Burleigh county housing authority is re-building 42 units for families and people with disabilities. One is slated to be done in October. Hoping for more accessible units for people with disabilities.
- Tribal Initiative
 - Updates given by Melissa Reardon, MFP Tribal Initiative program manager.
 - Explained bullet points on the PowerPoint used by Melissa.
 - Melissa has been contacted by other States with MFP programs who want to learn how to do the MFP paperwork with their Tribal Nations.
