# Authorization of SABG

- Title XIX, Part B of the Public Health Service Act
- Authorizing legislation for SAMHSA's block grants can be found at 42 U.S. Code Part B – Block Grants Regarding Mental Health and Substance Abuse
- Title 45—Public Welfare, Subtitle A—Department of Health and Human Services, Subchapter A, Part 96 Block Grants, Subpart L, Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant.

# Allocation to States


Block Grant Funds are allocated to states:

- States apply for these noncompetitive grants;
- SAMHSA uses a formula to allocate Block Grant funds to states;
- States establish their own bases for allocating Block Grant funds based on their unique behavioral health needs
