


NOTES:

This information reflects the total number of open cases by program for all HCBS recipients, not just TPM. Numbers are not unduplicated because individuals may receive services from multiple programs at the same time. SPED is the most utilized program because it has the least restrictive financial eligibility criteria. Individuals with less than \$50,000 in liquid assets may qualify for the SPED program. We have also seen an increased utilization of the Medicaid waiver (MW) because of residential habilitation and community support services, which can provide up to 24hour support in an integrated setting.





There was an 84% increase between 2021 and 2022 in the number of TPMs receiving housing supports. Some of this was due to a data collection change. The State was required to provide housing supports to at least 20 TPMs in year one of the SA (2021) and 30 TPMs in year two (2022). *The State has far exceeded that number.*
