## Family First Prevention Services Act

October 2019 – Implementation Deadline



### **Family First Prevention Services Act - Highlights**

**The Family First Prevention Services Act** was signed into law as part of the Bipartisan Budget Act on February 9, 2018. This act reforms the federal child welfare financing streams, Title IV-E and Title IV-B of the Social Security Act, to provide services to families who are at risk of entering the child welfare system.

- Prevention The bill aims to prevent children from entering foster care. Provides new title IV-E funding for prevention services for candidates for foster care and their families for:
  - Mental Health
  - Substance Abuse
  - In-Home Parent Skill-Based Programs (i.e. parenting skills training, parent education, and individual and family counseling)
- Reduce Congregate Care Placements incentives to states to reduce placement of children in congregate care.
  - Limitations on Title IV-E foster care payments for placements that are not foster family homes.
  - Allowable Placement Options family foster home, facility for pregnant/parenting foster youth,
     Supervised Independent Living Programs, specialized placements for victim of or at-risk of becoming victims of sex trafficking, and QRTPs. <u>RCCF level of care will no longer exist.</u>
- Qualified Residential Treatment Provider (QRTP) Requirements include:
  - Licensed and accredited
  - Trauma informed treatment model
  - Nursing and other clinical staff onsite
  - Child must meet level of care assessment
  - 60-day Judicial Determination Status Reviews
  - Full engagement with the family
  - 6 months post discharge follow-up



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- Family-Based Substance Abuse Treatment Facility Allows title IV-E foster care payments for eligible child placed with a parent in a licensed residential family-based substance abuse treatment facility.
- Kinship Navigator Programs to assist relative caregivers with programs and services to meet needs of children they are raising.
- Licensing Standards Waivers of non-safety licensing standards for relative caregivers.
- Chafee Program Expands Chafee and ETV age eligibility and individual ETV award \$ max.
- Foster Family Recruitment and Retention Authorizes competitive grants for recruitment and retention of high-quality foster families to increase capacity to place more children in family settings.
