Including:

- Number of acute care beds needed
- services
- Involvement of private providers
- The use of existing public facilities

• Appropriate locations for treatment and support





### Scope of Project

2. Development of options and a recommendation for 2021-23 biennium and 2023-25 biennium to contract with private acute psychiatric care facilities to provide treatment in 4 or more cities in the state.

3. Development of options and a recommendation for future use at of the state hospital, including the LaHaug Building.
