Contact Precautions

Contact precautions should be used with residents who may have a suspected or known infection that represents an increased risk for contact transmission.



Ensure appropriate placement of resident

• In long-term and other residential settings, make room placement decisions balancing risks to other residents

Use Personal Protective Equipment appropriately

- Wear a gown and gloves for all interactions that may involve contact with the resident or the resident's environment.
- Donn PPE upon room entry into the residents room
- Doff PPE and discard before exiting the resident room

Limit transport and Movement

- When transport or movement is necessary, cover or contain the infected or colonized areas of the resident's body.
- Remove and dispose of contaminated PPE and perform hand hygiene prior to transporting residents.
- Don clean PPE to handle the resident at the transport location.

Use disposable or dedicated equipment

 If common equipment for multiple residents is unavoidable, clean and disinfect such equipment before use on another resident.

Prioritize cleaning & disinfection of the rooms

- Rooms should be cleaned and disinfected at least daily.
- Focusing on frequently touched surfaces and equipment in the immediate vicinity of the resident.
