TANF (TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES)

Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) is a monthly cash assistance program for families and children younger than 18 or pregnant women with low incomes. This program provides temporary cash assistance and has work requirements.

People younger than 21 who qualify for Medicaid may be eligible to get a free health and developmental check-up from Health Tracks.
