QUALITY EARLY CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES FOR CHILDREN IN THE YEAR BEFORE THEY ENTER KINDERGARTEN

#### INTRODUCTION

- Competitive award established by the 2021 67th Legislative Assembly
- ND Legislative Session 2023, authorized Best in Class funding through June 2025
- Represents a targeted state investment in North Dakota programs whose actions can demonstrate the
  return on investment that is possible with intentional, research-supported investments in early childhood
- Programs are monitored, evaluated, and supported to help ensure the program investment has an impact

The Best in Class Grant program is built on over 20 years of research from similar programs across the country, especially the First Class Pre-K program in Alabama (we had the opportunity to visit their state last December and again in October for their Early Childhood Conference).

Alabama's program has been awarded the highest-quality rating by the National Institute for Early Education Research for 15 consecutive years. After seeing the impact of Alabama's First Class program firsthand, and seeing that they had extensive data showing results, ND legislators were intrigued.

# Reps. Weisz, Rohr and Westlind and Sens. Dever and Lee

sponsored the bill that established the Best in Class in the 2021 Legislature.

Best in Class offers resources for participating 4-year-old programs, including access to a higher level of support for staff through coaching, play-based curriculum, family engagement, connections to child health and development screening, measurement of child outcomes, and evaluation and enhancements of the space for quality early childhood experiences.

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### **PROGRAM CHARACTERISTICS**

- All children enrolled must be four years old before August 1st, 2024
- Admit children of all learning abilities into their program
- Operate for at least 400 hours over a period of at least 32 consecutive weeks. Programs operating at least 800 hours over 32 consecutive weeks are desired
- Incorporate at least 10 hours of family engagement

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#### **Baseline:**

Small Group of 8-10 children - \$60,000

Large Group of 11-20 children - \$120,000 (2 staff)

Tier 1 Calculation is based on the hours of operating your four-year-old program.

Part-time program 400 – 799 hours (<25 hrs/wk) = 50% of Baseline

Full-time program 800+ hours (25+ hrs/wk) = 100% of Baseline

Second Year and on-going participants have an additional tier which may reduce awards by half....

Tuition dependence and/or school district's free and reduced priced student enrollment

### Cash or in-kind match equal to 15% of total award

#### **Distribution of Funds**

 Based on Deliverables and a percentage of funds is distributed four times between September and June

### Second year 4 levers

- School district economic status (50% or greater)
- Fulltime or Parttime (minimum of 400hr or 800hr or more)
- Group size
- Tuition dependent

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#### **Program Components:**

- Tuition:
  - If charging tuition must use Best in Class sliding fee scale or charge less
- 50 % set aside spots for enrollment
  - The Child Information Form collects the information needed for the program to prioritize children who meet the 50% set aside slot criteria
  - Children whose household income is 60% SMI or less
- Children with an identified delay or disability
- Randomized Selection when it applies
  - If a program has more applicants in the set-aside pool than it has set-aside slots available, students will be selected through a randomized selection process within the set-aside pool.

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#### **Program Components:**

- Coaches support teaching staff throughout their participation in Best in Class
  - BIC Environment Standards
  - Community of Practice- held monthly
  - Curriculum
  - Gold Assessment
- Teaching Strategies
  - Required to use GOLD assessment tool ND state's license
    - Interrater Reliability
  - Creative Curriculum Preschool Guided Edition (Print and digital bundle)
  - Professional Development Required
  - Ready Rosie / Family engagement

### Coaching-

BIC environment standards- aligns with Creative Curriculum to offer space and materials that promote hands-on learning experiences to for investigations and play), Environment Needs Assessment (interest centers), priority of funds (for first year), partnership with companies to create catalogs for BIC

C2F app- informal observations, reflective dialogue, and creating action plans COP- different topics to support teachers

### **Teaching Strategies-**

Gold- Required to complete IRR, documentation (gather data in the moment- picture, video, ITE), complete checkpoints, Reports (positive feedback from families)

Creative Curriculum- programs are required to align their curriculum with the ELS not required to use CC (encouraged, wholistic) This curriculum offers individualized instruction by understanding how children's abilities progress and supporting them with unique color-coded progressions that show the typical development of skills from birth through third grade. Effectively scaffold learning experiences to respond to each child's current strengths and needs, <u>including those with disabilities</u>, with embedded guidance and strategies located on curricular resources.


### Als Pals- Social Emotional Curriculum (Supplement) to returning teachers

### **Professional Development**

- All programs have access to the Hub and all online training in TS and Quorum
- Provide 3 (6 hour) virtual trainings through TS to programs
  - Introduction to Creative Curriculum
  - Focus on Assessment (new programs)
  - Physical Environment
- Power of Observation Book Study- 10 hour (Returning Teachers)

### **Ready Rosie**

- Expectation that all programs invite families to receive weekly playlists



The state provided a license for each participating classroom with Creative Curriculum Cloud.

This gives them digital access to

CC: lesson plans that embrace all domains of learning and are enhanced with mighty minutes and intentional learning cards

Gold: Focuses on a continuum of learning and assess children

Ready Rosie: Provides beautiful videos for parents to watch and then do an activity with their child in their home setting.

Reports: Child Growth

PD: Rich resources on-line with 24/7 access

Intentional design for ongoing teacher feedback so we can learn from and with them along the way.
