

Sanitizing & Disinfecting

While you may at times be able to use the same product for sanitizing and disinfecting, the two processes serve different purposes. Always refer to the manufacturer's instructions to determine the correct process.

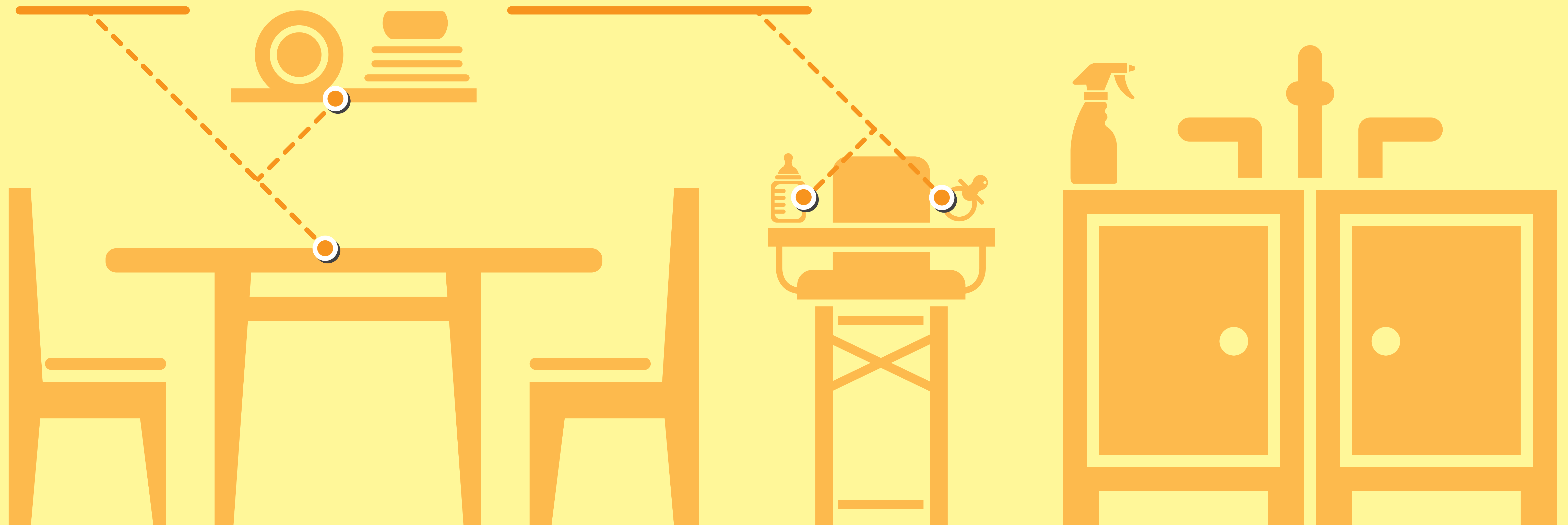
- Clean all surfaces with soap and water before sanitizing. To sanitize eating surfaces, spray with an EPA-registered product and follow instructions on labeled product. Do not use sponges, as they carry bacteria.
- Whether it's a reusable or disposable towel, use one towel per food-contact surface.
- Sanitize eating surfaces (tables, highchair trays, etc.) before and after each use - not while children are seated and eating at the table.
- Ensure tables have no adhesives, so they can be properly sanitized.

Sanitizers remove dirt and germs.

Use sanitizers on:

Food contact surfaces

Any object that is mouthed



Disinfectants remove and prevent the growth of germs.

Use disinfectants on:

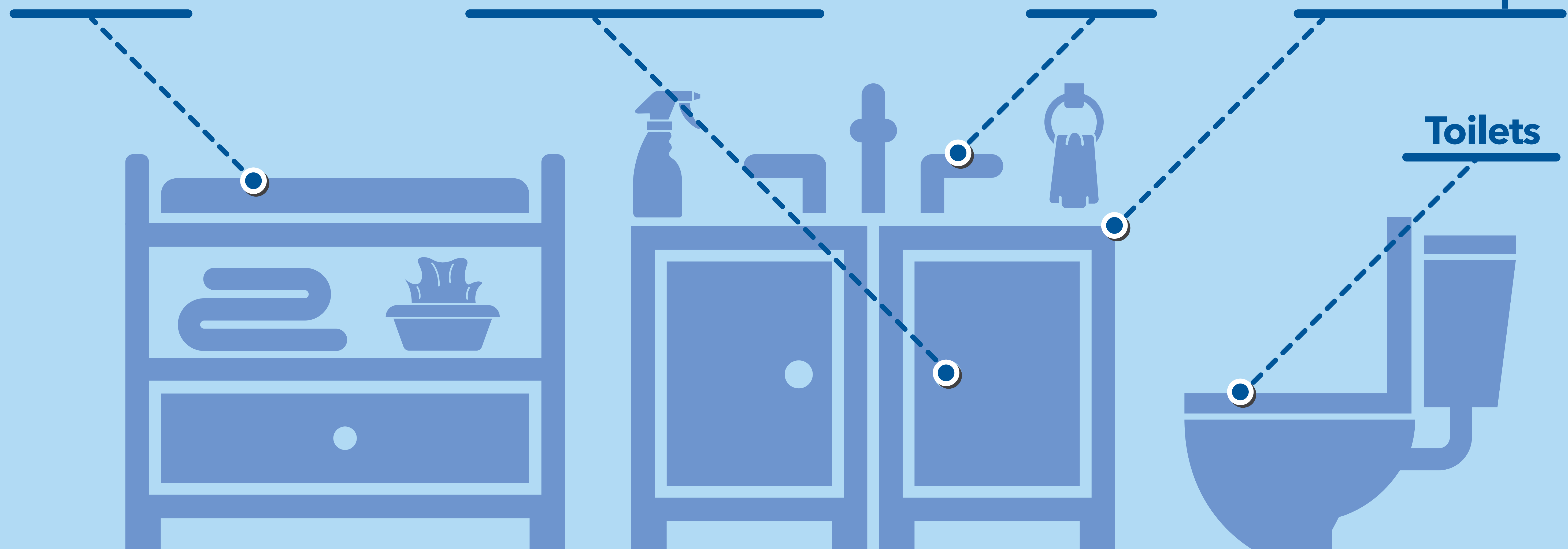
Diaper changing surfaces

Doorknobs & cabinet handles

Sinks

Toileting counter tops

Toilets



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
