Outpatient influenza-like illness visits and the percent of influenza specimens testing positive has also increased, a trend that was echoed nationwide, This week is National Influenza Vaccination Week, and the North Dakota Department of Health encourages everyone to get their influenza vaccination if they have not already done so! 





Laboratory-confirmed influenza is a reportable disease in North Dakota. Influenza "cases" include people that have tested positive for influenza in a healthcare setting. It does not include people with influenza who did not seek healthcare, or were diagnosed without a lab test, which is common. The true number of people in North Dakota is underrepresented, but case data allows us where influenza is circulating and in what populations. 
Influenza Cases by Gender




Influenza Cases by Age Group



Total Influenza Cases by County







Outpatient Influenza-like Illness (ILI) The NDDoH participates in the national U.S. Outpatient Influenza-like Illness Surveillance Network (ILINet). Data from participating outpatient providers in north Dakota are pooled to create a state-wide estimate for the weekly percent of healthcare visists due to influenza-like illness (ILI). Patients presenting with a fever of 100 degrees or greater AND a cough and/or sore throat are considered to have ILI. For more information on state and national ILINet data, see FluView Interactive


Sentinel Laboratory Data The NDDoH receives influenza and RSV testing data from participating sentinel laboratories across the state. The total number of positive tests and the total number of tests conducted are reported and used to create a state-wide percent positivity statistic. For influenza, percent positivity of 10% or greater indicates 'season level' influenza activity.

During the influenza season, increases in the **school absenteeism** data cab be used as an early indicator for influenza circulation. The NDDoH received absenteeism data from a majority of schools in the state. Data here include absences for all reasons.



During the influenza season, **influenza outbreaks** are common anywhere people gather, including schools, child care centers, long-term care facilities, and health care facilities. Outbreaks of influenza or influenza-like illness may be reported to the NDDoH. The following outbreaks have been reported this season.







Statewide Doses Administered

Influenza vaccine doses administered data from the North Dakota Immunization Information System (NDIIS) includes all administered doses of flu vaccine documented in the NDIIS to records with a North Dakota address. Adult immunizations do not have to be reported to the NDIIS so there may be more influenza vaccine doses being administered that are not reported to the NDIIS. Age groups are determined base on age at time of vaccination.




Doses Administered by Age Group




Statewide Flu Coverage for 2021-22 Season

Adult immunizations do not have to be reported to the NDIIS so adult coverage rates may be higher.


Statewide Flu Coverage for Adults > = 19
