Please contact Monique Runnels at <u>mrunnels@nd.gov</u> if you are interested in participating in this meeting.</li> <li>Medical Services will gather historical enrollment data reflecting the number of identified Tribal (we do not have data specific to which Tribe but can gather county-level data) members going back to the year before Medicaid Expansion began – 2013 (Expansion began in 2014).</li> <li>Follow-up: Data table attached to end of these minutes reflecting Tribal-county specific enrollment data for the year prior to (2013) and subsequent to (2014) Medicaid Expansion being implemented in North Dakota as well as the pre-COVID pandemic/continuous enrollment year (2019) and the year before continuous enrollment ended (2022). Caveat: Data is not a perfect representation but gives an idea of enrollment trends.</li> <li>Can Tribes license their own health care professionals?</li> <li>Response: This is something beyond the purview of ND Medicaid's authority. These include: <ul> <li>A limit increase from \$20,000 to \$40,000 for environmental modifications.</li> <li>Participants will have the option to have self-directed and provider managed in home supports authorized at the same time.</li> <li>Respite will be a stand-alone service.</li> <li>The waiver should be available for public comment by the middle of September.</li> <li>A presentation was given explaining this proposed waiver changes on August 14th. ## **Tribal Consultation**

**IMD Exclusion Discussion**: The federal Medicaid Institutions for Mental Diseases (IMD) Medicaid exclusion was discussed as ND Medicaid does not have a way to pay for members (ages 21-64) receiving services in facilities considered IMDs. This includes substance use disorder (SUD) treatment facilities with more than 16 beds. State authority to seek a State Plan Amendment expires under the SUPPORT for Patients and Communities Act expires September 30, 2023. States may also seek a section 1115 SUD demonstration waiver.

• Tribes asked what the process is to request ND Medicaid formally pursue a Section 1115 SUD demonstration waiver. The importance of a SUD waiver was discussed with new SUD treatment facilities being built and planned.

**Response:** The <u>SFN 905</u> may be filled out to request coverage of IMD facilities and submitted to ND Medicaid for analysis and a decision.

• Legislative authority would likely be required to pursue a SUD waiver. Is there any coordination that can occur regarding legislative activities and sharing information on legislative positions re: a potential SUD waiver?

**Response:** The answer to these questions will be dependent on submission of the SFN 905 and ND Medicaid's decision on whether to pursue coverage.
