




North Dakota Rural Health Transformation Survey

- On July 4, 2025, the One Big Beautiful Bill Act (H.R. 1) was signed into law, establishing the federal \$50 billion Rural Health Transformation Program (RHTP) to improve rural health care across all fifty states.
- RHTP will be administered by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) and appropriate \$50B over FFY2026 - FFY2030 (\$10B/Year) with funding flowing through states and a requirement to submit a "rural health transformation plan" to CMS. North Dakota is expected to receive at least \$100 million per year FFY 2026- FFY 2030.
- North Dakota Health and Human Services (HHS) is seeking input to help shape
 North Dakota's strategy for implementing the RHTP, which must align with criteria
 defined at the federal level by CMS. HHS is committed to advancing access to
 high quality services closer to home in support of strong, stable, healthy families
 and communities in North Dakota. The RHTP is an opportunity for North Dakota
 to invest in and transform rural health care in our state.
- The purpose of this survey is to gather input from a wide variety of stakeholders
 to inform North Dakota's strategic approach to the RHTP. HHS will review
 responses to this survey and may use information to shape North Dakota's Rural
 Health Transformation Plan and inform future funding opportunities, and guide
 state efforts related to rural health funding.

 does not constitute a commitment by HHS to fund any proposed activity. A
 formal Request for Proposal (RFP) or grant application process may follow.
